ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

An Initiative by Govt.of Assam (in the year 2010) to establish and constitute a teaching and residential University to secure to all stakeholders of Cooperative Management, education for widening knowledge and learning, training for enhancing skill and managerial capacity, develop ever growing number of cooperatives and to make efforts for all-round development of cooperative movement and rural economy.

VISION

The Vision of the University is to be an Innovative, Growing and Multi-disciplinary Institution of Learning committed to the principles of cooperation for socio-economic transformation with an international perspective and sensitivity to local needs.

MISSION

Schools of ARGUCOM

- **SCHOOL OF INNOVATION AND TECHNOLOGY**
- **SCHOOL OF PUBLIC POLICY AND LAW**
- **SCHOOL OF CULTURE AND MEDIA**
- **SCHOOL OF ECOLOGY AND SUSTENANCE**

FACILITIES at ARGUCOM

- a) **ACCOMMODATION:** Separate hostel facilities for boys and girls. All students are expected to reside in the allotted University hostels.
- b) **LABORATORY AND INTERNET:** The University has a well-equipped computer lab. Internet facility would soon be available and the University campus would also be covered by Wi-Fi.
- c) **UNIVERSITY LIBRARY:** The University is also striving to stock a reasonable number of books in the library. The library will also take online subscriptions from various sites for e-resources.



d) SCHOLARSHIPS: The University would try to facilitate various state and central govt. sponsored scholarships for the students and also scholarships provided by various govt and semi-govt.organisations like AICTE, NEC, etc.

e)CO-CURRICULAR AND EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES: Focuses on all round development of the students. The University encourages the students to excel in other areas of their interest.

f)LOAN FROM GRAMIN BANK: Chairman of Assam Gramin Vikash Bank visited the University on November 21, 2014 during which he addressed the students and assured all round help.

RULES AND REGULATIONS AT ARGUCOM

a)RAGGING: Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited in and outside the University campus. As per directions of Supreme court of India, students will submit an antiragging affidavit at the time of admission.

b)CLASS ATTENDANCE: Students should attend all classrooms lectures, discussions, library visits, institutional visits etc. Students will not be permitted to remain absent from institutional visits and other activities of the University. Attendance of students would be assessed regularly.

c) CREDIT SYSTEM: The University has adopted the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in evaluating the performance of the students. A trimester carries an average of 15 credits distributed among various papers. The number of classes of a paper in a trimester is divided by the number of working weeks to calculate the credit for a particular paper. In case of lectures, one hour class is equivalent to one credit and two hour tutorial is equivalent to nine trimesters. A student

may score a maximum of 'O' grade (90% and above), and the lowest being 'F' grade (less than 30%).

Requirements for admission to MBA

Essential Qualification	Mode of admission
HSLC Passed (Arts/Science/Commerce)	a. 60% and above-Direct admission.
Final HSLC students (Arts/Science/Commerce)	a. Students who may expect 60% marks in final HSLC exam can register for provisional admission.
Final HSLC students through AET-UG (June, 2016)	a. Final HSLC students can appear for the entrance test and qualify b. HSLC passed students with less than 60% can appear for the entrance test and qualify

NB:

1. A candidate is to apply in application form available in the University website along with Demand Draft of Rs 500 (non-refundable); Rs 250 (non-refundable) for SC/ST/PWD
2. Registration Fee is of Rs 5000 which is refundable in case of non-selection.
3. Registration fee is adjustable in case of selection.
4. PI and GD arranged in months of February and July.
5. Valid score of MAT/XAT/CAT/ATMA or others is also applicable.
6. Students with 60% marks will be admitted directly.
7. Relaxation for SC/ST candidates -5% (For direct admission, i.e. 55%).
8. Eligibility for students in any stream i.e., Arts/Science/Commerce.
9. Academic Council reserves the right for relaxation of eligibility criteria.
10. All payments must be made in Demand Draft from any nationalised bank in favour of **Assam Rajiv Gandhi University of Cooperative Management, payable at Sivasagar.**
